HOTELS

THE BRAZILIAN COURT

A member of Leading Hotels of the World, the historic Brazilian Court Hotel has been a Palm Beach staple since it opened as an apartment hotel in the 1920s. Boasting just 80 rooms and stunning Spanish Colonial architecture, its intimacy and seclusion makes the Brazilian Court a favorite with repeat guests. RESTAURANTS

FLORIE'S AT THE FOUR SEASONS PALM BEACH

Chef Mauro Colagreco's three Michelin-star restaurant on the French Riviera, Mirazur, has garnered global acclaim (it was named to the No. 1 spot on the World's 50 Best this year). Luckily, you don't have to go to France to experience Colagreco's food—he partnered with Four Seasons Palm Beach this year to open

GRANDVIEW PUBLIC MARKET

This 13,000-square-foot food hall in West Palm Beach is a one-stop-shop for food and entertainment—try everything from wood-fired pizza at Pizza Paradise, to poke at Poke Lab Eatery, to Hong Kong-style waffle cones and boba tea at Sugar Milk. EXPERIENCES

ANN NORTON SCULPTURE GARDEN

What was once the home of sculptor Ann Weaver Norton (second wife of Norton Museum of Art founder Ralph Norton) now houses nine of her larger-than-life sculptures, along with 100 works of art and 250 species of rare palms and cycads. *253 Barcelona Rd., West Palm Beach, info@ansg.org, 561.832.5328, ansg.org*

NORTON MUSEUM OF ART

Industrialist Ralph Hubbard Norton opened what is now the Norton Museum of Art in 1941 with his first wife, Elizabeth Calhoun Norton, but a recent \$110 million capital campaign and expansion have brought the museum a new round of attention (hedge funder Ken Griffin, a part-time resident of Palm Beach, gave \$16 million for naming rights to the wing). The Norton's expansion includes more than 12,000 new square feet of gallery space for its contemporary works. The museum's 7,000-piece collection also focuses heavily on American, European and Chinese art. The new wing and a 37,000-square-foot sculpture garden opened in February. *1450 S.
