from a rough “scrub” town for only the most intrepid travelers into a shiny new metropolitan mecca for high-end tourists and residents. To celebrate the 125th anniversary, the Historical Society curated an exhibit in its temporary gallery that reflects the city’s growth using primary and secondary sources.

The Historical Society will host a Facebook Live Event with Mayor James to kick off a series of events planned by the city around its quasicentennial — that’s 125 years — commemoration. The “Becoming” exhibition is on display at the Johnson Palm Beach County History Museum, 300 N. Dixie Highway on the second floor of the 1916 courthouse, West Palm Beach, until June 27.

The popular GreenMarket walking tours sponsored by the Historical Society will take on a 125-year theme, spotlighting the last 125 years of the city’s history, told through its landmark stops and stories. 
